- By taking the time to review, you are deepening the pathway in your brain where that information is stored, learning it better
- Reviewing can also help with organization and connecting material
- As you read, you may not have noticed how Topic #1 relates to Topic #5, but you noticed as you reviewed
- Or how Topic #3 is a bit all over the place and needs some structure
- The better organized your notes are, the easier it will be to study from them

- No worries! We all understand information to various degrees through various mediums
- Perhaps another textbook in the library explains something different?
- Talk to your instructor or a classmate
- Perhaps they can explain the tricky concept, theory... whatever in your textbook in a different way and with different examples

- It is very, VERY important for you to make sure you fix what you don't understand in case that information shows up as a test question
