CONVOCATION

St. Thomas University's Convocation is a gathering of the university community to confer degrees, present awards and medals, and hear the Address to Graduates and Valedictory. Convocation begins with a processional led by graduating students who are followed by faculty, officials, and guests. Each group occupies a designated position and the processional becomes a meeting of the university, the definition of convocation. The Chancellor and the President wear ceremonial St. Thomas University robes designed for their office, while many faculty wear the hoods and gowns of their *alma mater*. The university bestows honorary degrees on individuals who have been deemed deserving of recognition by a Joint Board of Governors-Senate Committee. Wearing green and gold-trimmed robes, St. Thomas University's colours, the recipients receive hoods symbolizing their degrees. Students who have met the university's academic standards are similarly hooded and formally granted all the honours, rights, and privileges pertaining to their degree.

EAGLE FEATHER

Graduating Indigenous students were gifted with Eagle Feathers at a ceremony and are carrying their feather as they receive their degree. In Indigenous communities, there is a sacred connection between the Eagle and the Creator as the Eagle flies highest and closest to the Creator and carries human prayers. In "The Story of the Eagle Feather," the Eagle offered one of its feathers to the human family as a sign of love and healing and a reminder of "Sacred Teachings." An Eagle Feather bestows honour and responsibility as it symbolizes being a messenger for respect, truth, courage, and wisdom as passed down by Elders.

KENTE STOLE

The Black Students' Association has worked with the university to introduce the Kente Stole to commemorate the differences and obstacles Black students overcome in order to graduate. Adapted from African tradition in Ghana, this woven cloth, which was once only worn by royalty, is a scarf-like garment worn over the shoulders that represents an accomplishment, graduation, or other rite of passage. The Kente Stole honours the legacy of Black ancestors and is a testament to each graduate's strength and excellence.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Marcel LeBrun is an inspirational tech executive, social entrepreneur, philanthropist, and community builder. Formerly the CEO of Radian6, Senior Vice-President at Salesforce.com and Venture Partner with Real Ventures, he and his wife Sheila now work to establish charities and projects that benefit people impacted by poverty and marginalization, as well as initiatives that benefit vulnerable youth through the LeBrun Family Foundation.



After his company, Radian6, was acquired by Salesforce.com, Marcel invested his own money into his new project, 12 Neighbours, a dignified affordable housing community in Fredericton. He created 12 Neighbours to give back to his community and to do his part to help those struggling with poverty and homelessness.

12 Neighbours is a tiny-home community, providing fully independent homes as affordable rental units, with supports, such as substance use recovery counselling and opportunities to improve health and education, as well as a social enterprise centre with training businesses designed to help people develop new skills and overcome employment barriers.

Two years ago, Marcel built the first tiny home in his backyard. His goal was to have 99 tiny homes in the community and is expected to complete all 99 by Spring Convocation. These homes are located on a 24-hectare plot of land in Fredericton and all include a kitchen, living space, bedroom, and a bathroom. They also all have a small deck and solar panels.

In addition to the 12 Neighbours Community, the LeBrun Family Foundation operates a youth summer camp, Snider Mountain Ranch in Sussex, NB, as well as a developmental program for at-risk youth.

FACULTY AWARDS

JOHN MCKENDY MEMORIAL TEACHING AWARD

Dr. Karla O'Regan is an Associate Professor in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice. She teaches courses in criminal law, criminal justice, criminal procedure, and feminist legal studies. She is described by her many nominators as an inspiring teacher and exceptional scholar who fosters a diverse and accepting learning community. Former and current students praise her for the influence her courses had in encouraging their own social activism, intellectual innovation, and passion for lifelong learning. As STU's Pre-Law Advisor for almost 20 years, she offers formal and informal sessions to help students prepare for the LSAT, law school applications, and legal studies. Dr. O'Regan often includes students in her research, providing exceptional opportunities to undergraduate students. She also continues these collaborations beyond her students' time at STU as they pursue law school and careers in the legal field. This award is meant to honour a professor who demonstrates exceptional qualities as a teacher. Like Dr. McKendy himself, the recipient encourages, challenges, inspires, and prepares students for success. Dr. O'Regan truly personifies the spirit of this award.



AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN PART-TIME TEACHING

Dr. Tracy Glynn is an Assistant Professor in Environment and Society. She teaches courses in Introduction to Environmental Problems, Introduction to Environmental Perspectives, Political Economy of Climate Change, and Environmental Praxis. Dr. Glynn also teaches courses in the Departments of Sociology, Human Rights, and Social Work at STU. Her teaching approach is enhanced by her diverse background as an advocate, educator, and independent media writer.



Dr. Glynn has championed students' engagement with their social universes outside the classroom, facilitating collaborative research projects and placements with various environmental and social justice organizations. She is known to draw on her community connections to bring practical perspectives into her classes. Dr. Glynn's relationships with organizations such as the Madhu Verma Migrant Justice Centre and the New Brunswick Coalition for Tenants Rights add to her teaching as she draws on real-world, community-based issues related to course material.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Dr. Jamie Gillies is a Professor in the Communications and Public Policy program. He is a highly accomplished expert in both American and Canadian politics and the author or co-author of five books, sixteen peer-reviewed book chapters, and six refereed journal articles. He is celebrated for his strengths in both coordinating highly academic research and explaining contemporary political developments to a general audience through regular media appearances. His academic work has gained considerable exposure in political communications circles and impacted the broader political science community. Dr. Gillies also has a diverse series of publications examining elections, political marketing and communications, populism, and popular culture. He frequently presents at conferences and is part of the executives of two regional political science associations. He has also served as the Canadian and Comparative Politics Section Chair of the New England Political Science Association and is currently President of the Atlantic Provinces Political Science Association. His scholarly work has developed into a multi-disciplinary agenda that explores American Politics, Canadian and New Brunswick Politics, Executive Leadership, Political Communications, and Communication Studies.



UNIVERSITY SERVICE AWARD

Dr. Mary Lou Babineau-Rosada is an Associate Professor and Chair of the Romance Languages Department. In addition to her role as chair of her department, Dr. Babineau-Rosada also serves as the Acting Chair of the Sociology Department. She has played a key role in search and renewal committees for senior administrative positions including for the President and Vice-Chancellor and Dean of Humanities. She has served on the University's Board of Governors and President's Advisory Committees on Campus Environmental Issues and Harassment and Discrimination. From 2004-2007 and 2013-2015, she was Chair of STU's United Way Campaign. Dr. Babineau-Rosada has also served on multiple Senate Committees and has contributed significantly to the faculty association at STU—as President from 2012 to 2015 and as Past President from 2015 to 2017. She went on to serve as President of the Federation of New Brunswick Faculty Associations from 2017-2019.
