The [Code of Ethics](#) from the [Australian Council of Professional Historians Association](#) (ACPHA) was published in August 2001. As a condition of membership in ACPHA, members must follow the highest standards of "professionalism, integrity and scholarship" as outlined in the Code.

The [Oral History Society](#), a national and international organization "dedicated to the collection and preservation of oral history," has posted [guidelines](#) that outline the interviewer's responsibilities before, during and after the interview. Responsibilities of sponsoring institutions are also documented.

The [Statement of Professional Standards and Ethics](#) offered by the [American Association for State and Local History](#) details the ethical expectations for its members. The AASLH makes available several ethical statements and related professional standards which can act as a guide for researchers.

Internet Research

The Government of Canada has published a site detailing [Conditions and Disclaimers Relating to Electronic Publications](#). These draft standards are available to interested persons for review and comment.

The [Association of Internet Researchers](#) (AoIR) is committed to ensuring that research on and about the Internet is conducted in an ethical and professional manner. The Ethics Working Group, composed of ethicists and researchers from 11 different countries, has produced an [ethics guide](#) to assist researchers in making ethical decisions in their research.

[Ethics of Internet Research](#) is a report contesting the Human Subjects Research Model which is increasingly invoked in discussions of ethics for Internet research. This report questions the widespread application of this model.

The goal of the [The Internet Research Ethics Clearinghouse](#) (IREC) is to expand the discussion and debate around Internet Research Ethics. The IREC aims to become a source of valuable information and resource sharing for researchers conducting, or preparing to conduct, online studies.
