Convocation

St. Thomas University's Convocation is a gathering of the university community to confer degrees, present awards and medals, and hear the Address to Graduates and Valedictory. Convocation begins with a processional led by graduating students who are followed by faculty, officials, and guests. Each group occupies a designated position and the processional becomes a meeting of the university, the definition of convocation. The Chancellor and the President wear ceremonial St. Thomas University robes designed for their office, while many faculty wear the hoods and gowns of their *alma mater*. The university bestows honorary degrees on individuals who have been deemed deserving of recognition by a Joint Board of Governors-Senate Committee. Wearing green and gold-trimmed robes, St. Thomas University's colours, the recipients receive hoods symbolizing their degrees. Students who have met the university's academic standards are similarly hooded and formally granted all the honours, rights, and privileges pertaining to their degree.

EAGLE FEATHER

Graduating Indigenous students were gifted with Eagle Feathers at a ceremony and are carrying their feather as they receive their degree. In Indigenous communities, there is a sacred connection between the Eagle and the Creator as the Eagle flies highest and closest to the Creator and carries human prayers. In "The Story of the Eagle Feather," the Eagle offered one of its feathers to the human family as a sign of love and healing and a reminder of "Sacred Teachings." An Eagle Feather bestows honour and responsibility as it symbolizes being a messenger for respect, truth, courage, and wisdom as passed down by Elders.

KENTE STOLE

The Black Students' Association has worked with the university to introduce the Kente Stole to commemorate the differences and obstacles Black students overcome in order to graduate. Adapted from African tradition in Ghana, this woven cloth, which was once only worn by royalty, is a scarf-like garment worn over the shoulder that represents an accomplishment, graduation, or other rite of passage. The Kente Stole honours the legacy of Black ancestors and is a testament to each graduate's strength and excellence.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

Ted Nolan is a championship and award-winning coach, philanthropist, and role model. He is Ojibway and grew up on the Garden River First Nation in Ontario. He went from skating on a backyard rink to minor and junior hockey, and then to being drafted by the Detroit Red Wings. As a young coach, he led the Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds to Ontario Hockey League Championships in 1991 and 1992 and won



the Memorial Cup in 1993. As a head coach in the NHL, he earned the Jack Adams Award for Coach of the Year in 1997. He led the Moncton Wildcats to the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League President's Cup in 2006. His international experience includes coaching the Latvian Men's National Team to the 2014 Sochi Olympics.

As a player and as a coach, Nolan faced discrimination and racism – he went from "loving the game to surviving the game" – though his success provided him with the opportunity to inspire Indigenous youth. In 2013, he set up the 3Nolans Hockey School with his sons Brandon and Jordan. They travel across Canada to develop the hockey skills and knowledge of Indigenous youth, and speak about the importance of active lifestyles and leadership in their communities. In 2004, he started the Ted Nolan Foundation to honour his late mother Rose and established the Rose Nolan Scholarship Fund which has provided scholarships to Indigenous women continuing their education. The foundation raised almost \$2 million and awarded scholarships to over 130 women. Nolan works for the Chiefs of Ontario Regional Office and this fall, Penguin Random House Canada will release his autobiography *Life in Two Worlds*.

Melanie Ann Ross is a native of Miramichi who excelled in music from an early age and earned awards from local and provincial music festivals. She graduated from Mount Allison University with a Bachelor of Music and a Bachelor of Education, and a Master of Education in Educational Leadership and Administration from St. Francis Xavier University. She is currently Principal at Halifax Regional Arts which



provides fine arts programming. She provides music liturgy at Christ the King Parish, Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, and St. Mary's Basilica in greater Halifax. She has been the director and organizer of many festivals and events, including the Helen Creighton Folklore Festival.

Ross has been a preserver and promoter of traditional music, keeping the history of the "old songs" alive and encouraging the writing of new ones. She is Artistic Director, performer, and emcee for the Miramichi Folksong Festival, the longest standing folk festival in Canada and an important part of preserving New Brunswick culture in song. Ross has participated in recording projects in Canada and Japan and has made six of her own recordings of folk and contemporary songs including *Songs of Ireland, From Our River, Live in Miramichi*, and *Miramichi Folk*. She has performed across Canada and in Thailand, Japan, China, Dubai, Switzerland, Ireland, and England. She has performed at Canadian and Maritime festivals including the Fundy Sea Shanty Festival, Lunenburg Folk Harbour Festival, Mahone Bay Wooden Boat Festival, Harbourfront Maritime Festival, the Royal Nova Scotia International Tattoo, and the Miramichi Irish and Scottish Festivals. She was awarded the Senate of Canada's 150 Anniversary Medal in 2017 for her contribution to her community.

FACULTY AWARDS

JOHN McKendy Memorial Teaching Award

Dr. Erin Fredericks is an Associate Professor in the Department of Sociology. She teaches courses in gender, disease, and health, as well as senior seminars in sociological concepts and healthcare policy. Her students know Dr. Fredericks as an accessible and engaging teacher who helps them to thoughtfully apply knowledge and develop critical perspectives. Her teaching aims are to cultivate mutual respect,



build skills for critical engagement, use trauma-informed perspectives, and create a community of learning, and through this she creates an "incredible classroom environment". She believes that learning happens when professors and students think about what silences them and have the conversation they wish society was having—what is difficult to ask? why we feel ashamed when we don't know? and why we strive for a certainty that is problematic? Her students find her "encouraging, supportive, and kind," and she reaches out to those who may be struggling, helping them to engage and grow. As the Learning and Teaching Development Officer, she has organized professional learning opportunities to enhance the culture of teaching and learning at STU.

Award for Excellence in Part-time Teaching

Dr. Janice Harvey is an Assistant Professor and Coordinator of the Environment and Society Program. Her motivation is to instill in students an ethic of ecological citizenship and she is inspired every day by their commitment to a sustainable future. She helps them to understand what is happening to the Earth systems underpinning their social world, why it is happening, and how they can achieve a sustainable future. She



teaches courses on understanding environmental problems, perspectives on human-nature relations, climate change, and environmental politics. She has developed several new courses which are now part of the Environment and Society curriculum. She challenges her students with innovative assignments and involves them in larger research projects such as the Plutonium Project which was recently presented at the Student Research and Ideas Fair. She also serves as the faculty advisor for the student group STU Sustainability.

University Scholarship Award

Dr. Kristi Allain is an Associate Professor in the Department of Sociology and a Canada Research Chair in Physical Culture and Social Life. Her scholarly work examines physical culture and its relationships with Canadian national identity, marginalization, and privilege. It explores the various ways that power operates within physical culture and has a particular focus on how individuals construct, understand, and challenge



expressions of gender, ethnicity, race, age, and nation. Her scholarly work has been prodigious as she has published 13 peer-reviewed journal articles, two book chapters, and two reports in recent years. Her work has proposed new theoretical frameworks for understanding hockey masculinity and the marginalization of older athletes and is often cited by other scholars. She is committed to communicating her scholarship to wider audiences including scholars, policymakers, and the public. As such, she speaks to the media on subjects such as hockey, curling, and national identity, and has been interviewed by outlets such as *The Hockey News*, *The Washington Post*, and the *Christian Science Monitor*.

University Service Award

Dr. Karla O'Regan is an Associate Professor in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice. She teaches courses in criminal law, criminal procedure, and feminist legal studies, and has been STU's Pre-Law Student Advisor since 2003. Her service record includes membership on many Senate, Faculty Association, University, and Student Union committees, as well as two terms on the Board of Governors and five



years as Research Ethics Board Chair. Much of her service work has centred on students, including chairing Senate Committees on Student Academic Grievance and Admissions and Academic Standing, and acting as a Complaints Officer under the Harassment and Discrimination Policy. She is a Sexual Violence Policy Adjudicator at UNB and has offered consent workshops for STU students and residence staff for more than fifteen years. O'Regan has worked with the NB Women's Council to provide input on new legislation, is a Research Fellow with the Muriel McQueen Fergusson Centre for Family Violence Research, and has collaborated with Sexual Violence NB.

Professor Emeritus

Dr. William L. (Bill) Randall, AB (Harvard), MDiv, EdD (Toronto), ThM (Princeton Theological Seminary), joined the Department of Gerontology in 1995. Over 27 years, he taught courses on aging related to development, health, learning, and creativity. He designed the course Narrative Gerontology, offering it annually from 1995 to 2021, and has been a world leader in developing a narrative perspective on



human development in later life. He has authored, co-authored, or co-edited 10 books, from The Stories We Are: An Essay in Self-Creation (1995) to the forthcoming Things That Matter: Special Objects in Our Stories as We Age. In addition, he has authored 24 book chapters and 30 articles in peer-reviewed journals in gerontology, social work, education, psychology, and theology. He served as founding Director of the Centre for Interdisciplinary Research on Narrative at STU which has attracted high-profile researchers and writers to deliver the annual "John McKendy Memorial Lecture in Narrative." As well as co-organizing Narrative Matters conferences, he co-edited the journal Narrative Works. He has been involved in numerous research projects funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, SSHRC-Canada Research Chairs, Canadian Institutes of Health Research, and the NB Innovation Fund. He was a member of the board of The Third Age Centre, project director of the Fredericton 80+ Study, and served on the boards of York Care Centre, Hospice Fredericton, and the Atlantic Institute on Aging. He has given keynote speeches, presentations, and workshops throughout North America and Europe for researchers, practitioners, and public audiences.
